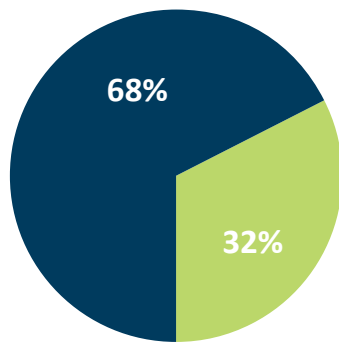

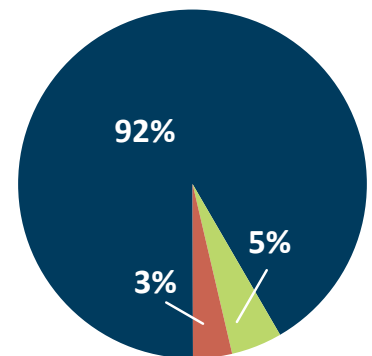

# 2019 HIGHLIGHTS

*Some of our accomplishments included:*

## NUTRITIOUS FOOD DISTRIBUTION

*– We provided more than 2 million meals per month to people statewide.*

<b><i>Distribution Highlights</i></b>	
Total food banks, hot meal programs, and high-need schools in the Northwest Harvest Hunger Response Network	380, meeting local needs in more than 200 Washington communities
Meals provided to children through our school-year food backpacks and our summer nutrition programs	261,633
People served at SODO Community Market in July, our first month	13,402
Eastern WA: we moved to a more functional Spokane warehouse, enabling us to serve 92,000 households in largely rural areas	Central WA: new volunteer equipment at our Yakima warehouse increased food output by 40%

Established our Root Out Hunger dinner series, creating a forum to discuss ways we can become a more inclusive and just society	10 local chefs committed to designing menus for breaking bread with a diverse community
Completed a year of planned equity work and finalized our Equity & Inclusion Charter	Designed an Equity Filter to guide program and policy work toward equitable outcomes
