



Program Service Accomplishments | Advocacy Highlights

Equitable access to school meals:

Eliminating the school lunch co-pay for families eligible for reduced price meals. More than half a million children are eligible for free and reduced price meals, with children of color disproportionately represented (83% of Black students, 62% of Native American students, and 79% of Pacific Islander students).

Increasing access to fruits and vegetables for low-income families:

Expanding the Women, Infants & Children, Farmers Market Voucher Program, and launching the Farm to School to Families Program that provides produce boxes to families, schools and summer meal programs, all from local farmers.

Expanding food stamps (SNAP) purchasing power:

More State matching dollars resulting in greater benefits for low-income families, plus transitional SNAP benefits to help households returning to work bridge the gap before their first paychecks.

Yakima Capital Campaign Progress

Sept 2020 – Feb 2021: Due diligence for Yakima land purchase

Oct 2020: Issued Contractor/Developer RFP

Jan - Mar 2021: Prep for Capital Campaign

Mar 2021: Land purchase complete, project manager hired, developer contract presented to Board Finance and Executive Committees

Apr 2021: Board approves design/build contract

Apr -Jun 2021: Preconstruction design and city permitting phase

May 2021: Racking layout confirmed, public announcement at Yakima site

June 2021: Tri-Ply orders pre-manufactured steel building, interior office design complete, site cleared and grubbed
